SUBJECT: HB 12/SB 205 (SUNSETTING "TO GO CUPS" AND DELIVERIES)

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**BACKGROUND**

On 19 March 2020, Governor Hogan signed Executive Order No. 20-03-19-02 which authorized alcoholic beverage retailers to sell and/or deliver alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed containers. SB205 (cross-filed with HB12) became effective on 1 July 2021. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2023 will be repealed.

The intention of this bill is to sunset Governor's Order No. 20-03-19-02. The bill confirms the procedures which dictate these off-premises sales and directs the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission and the Maryland Department of Health to conduct a study on the impact of the expansion of alcohol access under the Governor's 5 March 2020 "Declaration of State of Emergency and Existence of Catastrophic Health Emergency – COVID-19" and § 4-1107 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article. The Commission and the MDH is further directed to report the results of the study to the General Assembly on or before 31 December 2022.

At the July Liquor Board meeting, the Board discussed HB 12/SB 205, extending alcohol carryout/delivery privileges ("to go cups"). The Board approved the extension of the emergency order allowing alcoholic beverage retailers to sell and/or deliver alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption in sealed containers until 1 October 2021. The legislation outlines the potential for an extension of this sunset to run its course until 30 June 2023. It was the Board's position to shorten that timeframe in order to receive input from the County Commissioners, as well as to allow vested parties such as the Drug Free Coalition and the Maryland Licensed Beverage Association (MSLBA) time to provide comments.

At the August Liquor Board meeting, the Board scheduled a hearing on September 7th concerning extending /not extending this legislation.

Dear Property Owner, Public Official, Interested Person or Applicant:

On July 20, 2021 the Water and Science Administration (Administration) issued Water Appropriation and Use Permit Nos. QA2020G002(01) & QA2020S003(01) to Eldridge Cronshaw to appropriate and use a total annual average allocation of 55,300 gallons of water per day (gpd) for crop irrigation at the Pinder Farm that will be split between two permits. Permit QA2020S003(01) allocates water from an intake on German Branch. The allocation under this permit is an annual average of 36,900 gpd and a maximum daily withdrawal of 216,000 gallons. Permit QA2020G002(01) allocates water from two new wells in the Columbia aquifer. The allocation under this application is an annual average of 18,400 gpd and an average during the month of maximum use of 336,000 gpd. The site is located at 210 Murphy Road, Centreville, Queen's Anne County, Maryland.

After examination and consideration of the documents received and evidence in the applications files and records, the Administration has determined that the applications meet the statutory and regulatory criteria necessary for issuance of a Water Appropriation and Use Permit. The Impact Analysis Summary used in reaching this determination is enclosed with this permit decision. Copies of Water Appropriation and Use Permit Nos. QA2020G002(01) & QA2020S003(01) are available upon request.

This is a final agency determination; there is no further opportunity for administrative review. The applicant or any person with standing who participated in the public participation process through the submission of written or oral comments may petition for judicial review in the Circuit Court in the County where the permitted activity is to occur. The petition for judicial review must be filed within 30 days of the publication of the permit decision. Please see the attached fact sheet for additional information about the judicial review process.

## **FACT SHEET JUDICIAL REVIEW PROCESS**

Legislation passed by the 2009 General Assembly changes procedures for certain permits issued by the Department, including water appropriation permits. The judicial review procedures took effect on January 1, 2010 and applies to final permit decisions issued on and after January 1, 2010.

Under pre-existing procedures, permit applicants and third parties with standing under Maryland law could challenge the issuance of a permit or the conditions of a permit through a request for a "contested case" adjudicatory hearing conducted by the Office of Administrative Hearings. Effective January 1, 2010, the "contested case" process no longer applies to final decisions on applications for these permits. Rather, permits can be challenged through a request for direct judicial review in the Circuit Court for the county where the activity authorized by the permit will occur. Applicants, and persons who meet standing requirements under federal law and who participated in a public comment process by submitting written or oral comments (where an opportunity for public comment was provided), may seek judicial review. Judicial review will be based on the administrative record for the permit compiled by the Department and limited to issues raised in the public comment process (unless no public comment process was provided, in which case the review will be limited to issues that are connected to the permit).

### **Who Has Standing?**

Anyone who meets the threshold standing requirements under federal law and is either the applicant or someone who participated in the public participation process through the submission of written or oral comments, as provided in Environment Article § 5-204, Annotated Code of Maryland. The three traditional criteria for establishing standing under federal law are injury, causation, and redressability, although how each criterion is applied is highly fact-specific and varies from case to case. Further, an association has standing under federal law to bring suit on behalf of its members when its members would otherwise have standing to sue in their own right, the interests at stake are related to the organization's purpose, and neither the claim asserted nor the relief requested requires the participation of individual members in the lawsuit.

### **What is the Procedure for Seeking Judicial Review?**

Petitions for judicial review of a final determination or permit decision subject to judicial review must be filed in accordance with § 1-605 of the Environment Article no later than 30 days following publication by the Department of a notice of final determination or final permit decision and must be filed in the circuit court of the county where the permit application states that the proposed activity will occur. Petitions for judicial review must conform to the applicable Maryland Rules of Civil Procedure (Title 7, Chapter 200).

### ***IMPACT ANALYSIS SUMMARY***

#### **I. REASONABLENESS OF THE AMOUNT OF WATER REQUESTED IN RELATION TO THE ANTICIPATED LEVEL OF USE DURING THE PERMIT PERIOD.**

The applicant has requested to appropriate and use a total annual average allocation of 55,300 gallons of water per day (gpd) for crop irrigation at the Pinder Farm that will be split between two permits. Application QA2020S003/01 requests to withdraw water from an intake on German Branch. The allocation under this application is proposed to be an annual average of 36,900 gpd and a maximum daily withdrawal of 216,000 gallons. Application QA2020G002/01 requests to withdraw water from two new wells in the Columbia aquifer. The allocation under this application is proposed to be an annual average of 18,400 gpd and an average during the month of maximum use of 336,000 gpd. The Administration is proposing to issue both permits with a supplemental permit condition which will allow withdrawals under either permit to exceed the daily average allocation on a yearly basis as long as the total withdrawal under both permits does not exceed a daily average of 55,300 gallons annually.

Water demand is based on the type of crops to be irrigated, the number of irrigated acres, the type of soil(s), and the type of irrigation system to be used. The applicant plans on irrigating about 53.8 acres of grain corn in loam soils (water demand = 12 inches of water) using a low-pressure center pivot irrigation system with a water loss factor of 1.15 percent. The maximum day need is based on the anticipated maximum pumping rate for eighteen hours at 200 gallons per minute (gpm). The proposed quantities are reasonable for the requested use.

#### **II. REASONABLENESS OF THE IMPACT OF THE REQUESTED WITHDRAWAL ON THE RESOURCE.**

##### QA2020S003/01

The water intake is on German Branch, a tributary to the Tuckahoe Creek. German Branch has a drainage area of about 2.79 square miles (1,785 acres) above the proposed point of withdrawal. A flow analysis of German Branch was estimated using stream flow data from USGS gage (01491500) on the Tuckahoe Creek near Ruthsburg, Md, which is about 7.6 miles away from the intake location and within the same 8-digit watershed (Tuckahoe Creek). Using the scaling factor of 0.033, the flow in the Creek is determined from the published data on Tuckahoe Creek from March 1951 to September 1956; and from November 2000 to December 2020. A flow-by requirement of at least 0.24 cubic feet of water per second (108 gallons per minute (gpm)) past the downstream point of withdrawal will be included in the permit. As recommended by the Department of Natural Resources, the permittee will be required by permit condition to ensure that the intake pipe is covered with a screen having a nominal mesh size of one millimeter and that the intake velocity does not exceed 0.5 feet/second. No unreasonable impacts to the surface water resource are expected.

##### QA2020G002/01

Based on information obtained from Maryland Geological Survey Report of Investigation No. 40 and the Aquifer Information System (AIS), it was determined that the Columbia aquifer forms approximately the top 51 feet (ft) of earth material at the site. The impact of the requested withdrawal on the water table (unconfined) aquifer like the Columbia is based on the annual rainfall (43.2 inches) that falls in the area, the amount of

recharge (infiltration) on the applicant's property during a drought year, and the amount of groundwater set aside to maintain stream baseflow. In addition, 15% of the irrigation water which is not used by crops infiltrates back into the aquifer. Based on the factors above, the Administration's analysis indicates that the long-term consumptive use of the proposed withdrawal is 56% of the drought year recharge available at the site. Hence, the proposed withdrawal from the Columbia aquifer is sustainable. This analysis assumes all water is from groundwater without any contribution from the surface water source. No unreasonable impacts to the groundwater resource are expected.

### **III. REASONABLENESS OF THE IMPACT OF THE REQUESTED WITHDRAWAL ON OTHER USERS OF THE RESOURCE.**

#### QA2020S003/01

There are five permitted users of German Branch with withdrawal locations downstream of this proposed intake location. All permitted users are in the non-tidal portion of the German Branch. The closest permittee is 2.7 miles downstream, is not currently withdrawing from German Branch. The farthest user downstream is 6.2 miles from the proposed intake location. No unreasonable impacts to other users are anticipated.

#### QA2020G002/01

Time-distance-drawdown projections were developed using a transmissivity of 3,400 ft<sup>2</sup>/day calculated from on-site well# QA-17-0082 and a storage coefficient of 0.1 taken from published literature. These values were used in computer modeling. A withdrawal of 336,000 gpd in the month of maximum use for 60 days with no recharge to the aquifer produces a drawdown of less than four ft in the Columbia aquifer at a distance of 1,000 ft (estimated nearest Columbia aquifer well). Drawdown will decrease as distance from the well increases. A review of the wells database indicates there are 10 wells in the Columbia aquifer within a distance of about 1,000 ft from the groundwater wells. One well is used for irrigation purposes and nine wells are test wells. No unreasonable impacts to other users of the resource are expected.

Atlantic Broadband has a few updates regarding programming changes that will be taking effect over the next 60 days. Please see below for detailed information.

Effective 7/01/21, Atlantic Broadband will no longer carry the following HD Ultra Channels MTV Live, MGM and charges for HD Ultra will be removed. MGM will be permanently removed and we are moving MTV Live to our Epix premium Add-On package. Affected Markets within Mid-Atlantic: Berwick, PA, St. Mary's, MD, King George, VA.

Effective 7/13/21, install fees will change to a \$79 flat fee regardless of how many lines of business are added, replacing the current Atlantic Broadband install fee rate of \$50 per line of service. This fee will be assessed to customers who are eligible for Self-Install but opt for Professional Install.

Effective 7/13/21, customers in the following states PA, VA, DE, and NY will now receive a ONE time late fee in the amount of \$10, for any month they are delinquent.
