General Items Discussed or Shared:

- Bob discussed the meeting with the Queenstown Planning team on June 1st. It was attended by Bob, Leslie, Nate, and Nancy and Steve Chandlee. Queenstown team showed us their Master Plan and how their town trials could connect to the county. Queenstown is very supportive to work with the county. Parks and Rec. Dept. will be leading the feasibility of creating a county Master Plan.
- Information was discussed regarding the development of a scope of work for Master Plan consultant. This was in reference to an email sent on 9 Aug 2022 at 1049 from Nancy suggesting next steps. Steve Chandlee will follow up with Kimlee-Horn on this matter. It was discussed as to how to make the plan actionable and not merely a strategic vision plan. BPAC role would be to support external consultant and Park's as well as working with local community organizations, HOA's, etc. to solicit public input.
- Bob will attend the next PRAB meeting, 19 Sept at 6pm assuming this topic is on agenda. The meeting is open to all BPAC members.
- There was a brief discussion about any new development projects, the new storage facility on Nash Court and how this might impact the cross island trail in that area.
