ABOUT US

The Parks and Recreation Department consists of five major operating divisions: Parks, Recreation, Airport, Public Landings, and Golf Course. Together, these divisions maintain more than 3,113 acres of Park property throughout Queen Anne's County, in addition to maintenance, grass cutting, and snow removal for Board of Education (BOE) grounds and recreation facilities at 16 school sites totaling 320 acres. The Parks division alone is responsible for 22 county parks and 10 county natural resource areas. While the Public Landings division operates and maintains 18 landings, 2 fishing piers, and 3 marinas. These five divisions provide boundless public recreation opportunities by air, land, and water.

The Recreation Division is responsible for providing recreation and leisure time experiences for Queen Anne's County citizens of all ages. This includes trips and tours, therapeutic programs, indoor and outdoor sports programs, aquatics programs, and part-time/seasonal employment. The Recreation Division offers a wide array of recreational programming including classes, special events, summer camps and social activities. Leagues are offered year-round for both youth and adult sports enthusiasts.

PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD

The Board advises the Department of Parks and Recreation and the County Commissioners on all questions of general policy relating to parks and public recreation in the County. The Board also advises the department as to matters of general policy and direction, and when appropriate, brings matter of public interest to the attention of the Department and County Administration. This Board also sets fees and charges for all those properties, programs and activities supervised or controlled by the Department of Parks and Recreation.




Matapeake Clubhouse

Public Landings and Piers

The Public Landings Division of the Department of Parks and Recreation provides 18 public landings, 2 with fishing piers, and 3 marinas with 172 boat slips. These facilities comprise more than 27.3 acres of land throughout Queen Anne's County.

Queen Anne's County Public Landings offers two types of permits, an Annual or Daily; fees based off in-state and out of state residents. To use any of the public landings, a current permit must be displayed by each vehicle, with or without a trailer, for either the launching of a boat or for general parking. The permit does not allow you to use the fishing piers. A separate parking ticket must be purchased from the pay machine when you arrive at either Matapeake or Romancoke Fishing Pier.

Romancoke Fishing Pier and adjoining picnic area is open from 6am to 9pm. Matapeake Pier and boat launch is open 24 hours. Matapeake picnic area is open from sunrise to sunset.

TRAILS



CROSS ISLAND TRAIL

This 7-mile trail goes from Terrapin Nature Park on the shores of the Chesapeake Bay to the Kent Narrows Waterfront district. The trail affords pedestrians', runners, and cyclist unique opportunities to view wildlife in an environmentally sensitive deigned setting all while enjoying the scenery of the waterfront, canopied woodland and access to public parks. ADA accessible.

Directions: From East to West, off street parking is available at the Terrapin Nature Park, Old Love Point Park, Chesapeake Heritage & Visitor Center, and the public lots beneath the Kent Narrows US 50/301 bridge. These parks and lots are open daily from sunrise to sunset.

This idyllic 7-mile paved pathway, nestled in Stevensville, treats you to breathtaking waterfront vistas as you leisurely walk, run, or cycle your way from Matapeake Beach to Romancock Pier. Plan for about 2 hours and 20 minutes for your one-way journey. Lots of photo ops are available capturing the beauty of woodlands, residential neighborhoods, and open fields the unfold along your route, tracing a path from the Chesapeake Bay to Eastern Bay.

Directions: Trail begins at Matapeake Beach and ends at Romancock Pier. Parking and parks are open sunrise to sunset. Romancock Pier is open from 6:00a.m. - 9:00p.m.

Romancock pier use the pay and display system in which the on-site machine accepts cash or credit cards and produces a receipt which must be displayed face-up on your vehicle's dashboard. All visitors who use a parking space for any reason must pay for a parking receipt.

GENERAL INFORMATION

CAMP REGISTRATION

Camp fees are established by determining the cost of supplies, fees for instructors, rentals, program administration, and the price of marketing in order to deliver high quality programs at an affordable price.

DISCOVER SUMMER PARTICIPATION

Only individuals who are registered may participate. Where age restrictions apply, participants must be the age of 6-12 as of the start camp date. If any other standards apply, they will be noted in the Guide and the online registration.

For many programs, registrants or parents/legal guardians of minor registrants will be required to provide a signed Participation Information form at the first meeting. The purpose of this form is to ensure that all participants willingly share responsibility for their own safety. All activities contain inherent risks that each participant is urged to consult his or her physician concerning his or her fitness to participate. Please note that many camps will require confirmations that immunizations are current.

An authorized parent or legal guardian must accompany a child each day for both check-in and pick-up. It is your responsibility to sign your child in at the beginning of the program and sign your child out immediately following the program.

A \$15 fee will be assessed if your child is dropped off early or picked up late AND are not enrolled in before care.

Children must remain with the program for the full period scheduled. To leave before a day's camp is complete, a child must have written parental consent or the parent/guardian must pick the child up after notifying the camp director. No refunds will be issued for time missed for this or from dismissals resulting from disciplinary action.

DISCOVER SUMMER & SUMMER DAYS CAMP REFUND POLICY

We recognize that you may wish to withdrawal from a camp for a variety of reasons, but we encourage early decisions so as not to inconvenience other participants or affect our ability to efficiently deliver activities.

A \$50 non-refundable fee will be charged for all participant initiated refund requests. If the department cancels the program, a full refund will be issued. Refunds will either be credited back to the credit card used in 3 to 5 business days or a check will be issued within 2-3 weeks (if paid by cash or check). To request a refund please email qacrecreation@qac.org.

**There are no refunds given for missed days of camp.
No refunds after the first day or after the program ends.**

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

- Children must listen and follow all instructions by staff at all times.
- Treat other children, all staff, equipment and facilities with respect and care.
- Any participant found to be in possession of any drug, alcohol, tobacco products or weapon will be immediately dismissed from the program. NO refund will be issued.
- Any actions that cause injury to another child, or may have caused injury had the staff not intervened, may result in immediate dismissal from the program. The safety of children is paramount, and we want everyone to have an enjoyable experience.
- All acts of bullying, harassment, and intimidation will not be tolerated. This will result in immediate dismissal from the program. NO refund will be issued.

PHOTO/VIDEO POLICY

Participants in activities may be photographed during the course of the programs. These images may be reproduced for publicity purposes in our seasonal Program Guides, on the Queen Anne's County website or in approved contractors or sponsors publicity materials. No materials will be used for personal or professional gain by staff or contractors without further permission of parent/guardian.

CANCELED PROGRAMS

We don't like to cancel camps, but each one must meet its minimum enrollment. Don't be disappointed - register early and bring a friend! An activity may be canceled due to circumstances beyond our control, such as the unavailability of an instructor or location. If a camp is canceled, registrants will be contacted immediately and a full refund issued.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Queen Anne's County Department of Parks and Recreation can provide limited financial assistance to Queen Anne's County residents who qualify. In addition to a completed application, you must provide any proof of assistance from the Department of Social Services. Funds are limited and a deposit of 25% of the program fee is required at least one month prior to the start date with the application/registration form. Please call 410-758-0835 for additional information and guidelines.

GENERAL INFORMATION

GENERAL REFUND POLICY

For activities, leagues, classes, and special events:

- Additional refund policies for a specific program or event could override the current policies listed.
- A 20% Administrative Fee will be charged for all participant-initiated refund requests, with a maximum fee of \$50. If the department cancels the program, a full refund will be issued. Refunds will either be credited back to the credit card used in 3 to 5 business days or a check will be issued within 2-3 weeks (if paid by cash or check). To request a refund please email qacrecreation@qac.org.
- No refunds will be given after a program ends.
- No refunds for missed classes or games.
- No refunds after the first session or first game.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

- Advance registration for programs is required since most class sizes are limited. We will not accept registration by phone or at the class.
- Registrations are accepted on a "first come" basis.
- Age is determined by September 1 for league play. Children must play in their respective age group.
- We reserve the right to cancel or alter programs that don't meet minimum registration requirements.
- Parents are to arrive five minutes before the program's closing to pick up their child. Failure to do so could result in the child's removal from the program.
- When there is a school closing, our programs are canceled. (This includes scheduled school closures and half days.) Special school meetings, activities or weather conditions may also be reasons for program cancellations. We (Recreation Staff or Vendor Instructor) will notify you of any cancellations and advise you of the make-up date.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Check with your instructor about exceptions to the following circumstances and make-up dates for canceled sessions.

- If it rains, outdoor camps may be canceled
- When lightning is a potential threat to participants, scheduled outdoor activities or activities in progress may be canceled.
- If there is inclement weather or an emergency plan is in effect in Queen Anne's County, scheduled camps will be canceled.
- If schools are closed or dismissed early due to inclement weather, camps in schools will not be held.

OUTDOOR INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

All play on park athletic fields is prohibited when:

- The field is deemed unplayable by parks and recreation staff
- The field is closed for renovation or repair
- Water is standing on the field
- ½ inch of rain or more has fallen within the previous 24 hours
- Soil is frozen
- Soil is wet and "spongy"
- The ground is muddy and soil clumps or clings to shoes
- Steady rain is falling
- A lightning/thunderstorm is occurring

*** Permit holders will be held financially responsible for any damages due to failure to suspend play when conditions worsen.**

BUS TRIP REFUND POLICY

A 30-day cancellation notice is required from the participant when initiating a refund request. Any refund will be assessed a 20% administrative Fee or maximum of \$50. If the participant cancels within 29 days of the departure of the trip no refund will be given. To request a refund please email qacrecreation@qac.org, subject line "Refund Request".

BUS TRIP GUIDELINES

- Queen Anne's County Department of Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel a trip due to insufficient registration. Registered participants will receive a full refund.
- A Queen Anne's County Department of Parks and Recreation waiver & release form must be signed by every participant. If the participant is a minor, the form must be signed by a parent or guardian. All minors must be accompanied by an adult.

QAC PUBLIC LANDINGS

To use any of the public landings, a current permit must be displayed by each vehicle, with or without a trailer, for either the launching of a boat or for general parking. Annual permits are \$40 for Maryland resident and \$75 for out of state; One-day permits are \$10 for Maryland resident and \$15 for out of state. The permit does not allow you to use the fishing piers. A separate parking ticket must be purchased from the pay machine when you arrive at either Matapeake or Romancoke Fishing Pier.
